For the past 10 years we have sponsored the Chosica Girls Orphanage near Lima, Peru. We are helping the girls with expenses for school supplies, food and clothing.



In 2004 we built The Jack Wolff School near the Amazon River in Iquitos, Peru. The school has expanded to over 1,000 students. This year we bought and installed ten new computers and WIFI internet in their computer room.



Toka Rachael lives in Ghana, Africa. She is 20 years old and she grew up on a small farm. Toka is studying Home Economics at the Junior College. She wants to be a chef and open her own restaurant. We have been helping her with her tuition and living expenses at the Junior College which are about \$1,000 per year. She is the first person from her family of eight brothers to attend college.



We met Aracely Jumpa in the Amazon Jungle of Peru when she was 6 years old. She ended up in an orphanage and we have supported her for the past 10 years. Last year she came to the United States. We are helping her attend college in California. She is a good example of someone who succeeded when given the chance.
